Provision:	I oppose and wish to amend. The reasons are:	I seek the provision is amended as set out below:
Rule 3.11.5.7	Land use restrictions will have a big influence on land prices. Dairy farmers will not be able to purchase neighbouring dry stock propertiesto expand their milking platform, nor will forestry blocks be able to go back into productive farmland. A concenst will be needed for anybody willing to try, but will be near impossible to get. This will have a big influence of farm price and a lot of farmers land will decrease especially if the farm has a tree plantation on it which one day was going to go back into pasture. That land will no longer be looked at as farmable therefore the price of the farm will decrease.	Converting farms should be monitored more closely, in the past maginal land was converted, which should never of been aloud to happen. Land Use Capibilities (LUC) should be looked at when a farm is looking to change its land use and if it fits into the category of the contour/soil type, then the farmer should be free to swap between demandng markets.

Rule 3.11.5.4	Our catchement has proven in water quality tests that we do not have a nitrogen (N) leaching problem. N Grandparenting would restrict stock numbers unnecessarily and stop farmers having flexability to adapt to market changes.	Fence necessary and practical waterways, there needs to be some leaniancy with some waterways physically and economically impossible to fence off which will help reduce sediment (P) and E. coli entering our waters. Dam up waterways higher up the headwaters which allows sediment to settle out would be another option instead of fencing off all little streams and will also provide homes for bird life.
