

Continuing: The specific provisions of proposed plan Change 1 that my submission relates to.

The whole plan subjugates the rights and responsibilities of all landowners within this plan's catchment. The National Policy statement for Freshwater management 2014 which includes managing land use and developing activities to achieve a lower environmental footprint states that this management must underpin community discussions; with communities to determine pathways and timeframes. It does not state that the regional council and its group of 24 must take this on themselves to inflict their views and right to autocratically determine the future directions and dictate the future developments of individual land owners. Landowners can and must take on that responsibility themselves and not as directed by a "farm planner". If a landowner wants help with determining their future they can decide that themselves. Farmers are being treated as "fools".

The values stated in the Healthy Rivers plan do not acknowledge the intrinsic values (Mana Atua) of longterm residents of European origin; who respect and value the river, the ecology, the biology and the protection of the environment, appreciation of the landscape, and the experiences through generations. Such values are not just an attribute of Mana Whenua. This needs to be acknowledged.

The vision is fine but it is the "how" that we oppose. A black picture of farming practices has been planted in the media and "out there" over the recent and current actions by farmers which is frankly overstated and overlooks the exceptional work undertaken by farmers to mitigate and enhance their properties and waterways.

As a farming partnership, acknowledged for our work by the Balance Farm Environment Awards, has for 40 years fostered conservative and sensible farming practices as per stocking rates and almost no use of additional nitrogen; have fenced stock out of waterways for over 30 years; undertaken extensive riparian planting and conserved bush remnants with the QEII trust over a period of 40 years – we take significant umbrage at the approach taken in this plan. Now to be told that by 2026 we must destock. This appears an abusive of power which I am not sure you have?

The majority of farmers are committed to their properties and the surrounding communities, and want the best for themselves and the future of the country. And that includes the economic growth of the area. There is no need to destroy what is in place – viable communities offering a way of life which appeals to a wide section of society. With the future outcome for this plan is set to destroy the economic potential of the Waikato River Valley.
