Background and Introduction: Submission PC1 Plan Change. Ryan Farms, (P&M Ryan Trust). 8<sup>th</sup> March 2017.

We are a 3<sup>rd</sup> Generation Vegetable Grower and Onion Seed Breeding Family Business based in Pook Road, Harrisville. My Great Grandfather began Vegetable Production in the late 1940s on this farm.

Our total area compromises of 9.54ha of Patamahoe Clay Loam soil, with an average rainfall of 1400mm, we are on mixed rolling terrain. We have recently set aside a parcel of land into a conservation lot with a developing wetland.

Our main areas of activity are Onion Plant Breeding which includes onion production for plant breeding purposes as well as seed production. We supply onion seed to all of New Zealand, the majority of which is based in Northern Waikato and South Auckland. We also supply the international Markets of Australia, USA and South Africa.
