to the plan


that addresses the adverse effects of discharges to the Waipa and Waikato River Catchments.

use information from step 1 and from impartial scientists and experts


3 Develop options and policy mix

- 2. Some non regulatory methods may be implemented outside the RMA e.g. Primary industry agreements to work with farmers








